Early in 2020, we had been considering increasing membership fees for 2021 but did not consider this appropriate to implement due to the Pandemic.

The Committee has now reluctantly decided to increase membership fees for 2023 to £20 for single membership and £30 for joint membership. Our long-term plan is to review membership fees every two years so, unless our financial situation deteriorates further, our next membership fee review will be in October 2024
